**Program Description:** Individualized services funded by the MedWaiver Program include day activities such as supported employment, adult day training, companion and non-residential supports and services, and extend to residential services that include specialized medical or behavioral services. All services must be medically necessary and meet conditions established by the Agency for Health Care Administration.

**Population Served**: Individuals with a developmental disability that meet the eligibility criteria defined by Florida Statute 393.

Service Area: Suncoast Region includes Hillsborough, Desoto, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas and Sarasota Counties.

**Referral Process:** Call for appointment in Hillsborough at (813) 233-4300 or download application for services at <u>http://www.apd.myflorida.com/customers/application.htm</u>. For more information, call toll free at (866) 273-2273.

**Eligibility Criteria:** Eligible customers include Florida residents ages 3 and above, diagnosed as having one or more of the following categorical developmental disabilities (onset prior to age 18 and can be reasonably expected to last): Mental Retardation, Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Spina Bifida, Prader-Willi Syndrome, and High-risk.

Service Fee Structure: There is no cost to clients.

Bilingual Services: Yes, available upon request.

**Program Description:** The Bay Area Early Steps program serves infants and toddlers from birth to 36 months who have developmental disabilities or delays. Any child in this age range for which there is a suspicion of a developmental concern should be referred, as the program is a federal entitlement program under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The program provides service coordination, medical and behavioral specialists, early intervention and therapy services, family support services, provider and family workshops, equipment and adaptive toy lending libraries

### Organization of Region:

USF provides entry into the Bay Area system (Polk and Hillsborough Counties) with eligibility evaluations via developmental, medical, and behavioral specialists. USF provides guidance, coordination, and assistance to community teams that conduct eligibility evaluations and provide direct services such as therapy, early intervention, and instructional support. USF provides for the development, coordination, and monitoring of the Individualized Family Support Plan (IFSP), which documents eligibility and treatment interventions. USF provides professional staff to support provider and family development through trainings and in-services, outreach, community collaboration, and agency partnerships.

Infants & Young Children of West Central Florida, Inc., known as IYC, operates the provider network for the Bay Area region. It serves as the network's fiscal agent and home for the local Early Steps Central Directory. Early intervention, therapy services, and family support services are networked through IYC. This includes provider and family workshops, equipment and adaptive toy lending libraries, as well as direct services. IYC provides marketing and outreach services, and serves on local boards to increase linkages for the program and to cultivate support services for families.

**Population Served**: Infants & toddlers with, or who are at risk for, developmental disabilities and delays.

Service Area: Hillsborough and Polk Counties

**Referral Process:** Referrals can be directed to the **Referral Line** at (866) 549-1740 (Toll Free) or (813) 974-0602, or faxed to (813) 558-1343.

**Eligibility Criteria:** Developmental disability or delay, or the suspicion of a disability or delay. There are no financial criteria.

Service Fee Structure: There currently is no cost to families. Medicaid, third party insurance, and federal IDEA Part C funding cover the cost of services. All rates are based on Medicaid reimbursement rates.

**Program Description:** The overall goal of the Family Outreach & Support Program (FOSP) is to improve family functioning by encouraging healthy social, emotional and behavioral development of children, strengthening family relationships and promoting self sufficiency and resiliency of poor minority, primarily single parent families in East, Northeast Tampa (King High School cluster) and the inner city area. The program aims to assist families with promoting school readiness and developing life skills that will reduce risk factors for child abuse, domestic violence, delinquency and school failure.

**Population Served:** FOSP provides services to low-income children and families who reside in Northeast and inner-city Tampa who are in need of counseling, case management and/or life skills education classes. The program is not designed to serve individuals with chronic mental health conditions.

**Service Area:** FOSP provides services to all children and families enrolled at select private, charter schools, childcare centers and after school programs in the East Tampa, USF area and inner city Tampa communities. Residents of the targeted zip codes – 33602, 33603, 33604, 33605, 33607, 33610, 33612, 33613, 33617, 33620 and 33637 are also eligible for services.

**Referral Process:** All children and families participating at the partner agencies will be eligible for an initial assessment and case management services. Teachers and staff of schools and childcare centers make referrals to the program by submitting a Catholic

Charities Pre-Admission Form. Family Support Specialists make initial contact with the child and/or family within two (2) working days of receiving a referral. Families who need clinical counseling are referred by school or child care center staff to an FOSP coun selor who contacts the family within one (1) week of receiving referral. A psychosocial assessment is also completed and a service plan developed with the family.

If service needs identified in the assessment cannot be provided by Catholic Charities, referrals will be made to other appropriate service providers in the community.

Eligibility Criteria: Children birth to 8 years old and their families who need counseling, case management and life skills education services.

Service Fee Structure: There are no fees for program services. FOSP is grant-funded.

**Program Description:** The Kinship Care program preserves and strengthens families with relative caregivers through a strength-based model building on family assets, promoting self-sufficiency, and resiliency, helping families achieve their optimal development, and connecting families with natural and community resources for ongoing support and assistance. Services include case management and support groups that can be psycho-educational and/or therapeutic groups. Case management services include information and referrals to other community providers as well as providing limited wrap-around funds to help stabilize families, as needed.

Population Served: Relative caregivers, children, and families.

Service Area: Services are provided by Catholic Charities in partnership with Partners of Hillsborough and Tampa Metro YMCA to residents from the following zip codes: 33569, 33534, 33572, 33573, 33594, 33570, 33598, and 33834. Three other service providers work in partnership with Partners of Hillsborough and Tampa YMCA to offer services throughout Hillsborough County, with remaining zip codes allocated to the nearest agencies.

**Referral Process:** Self-referral, from the Kinship Care Warmline, or from community agencies. Call Partners of Hillsborough at (813) 924-2854 for in-take and triage to appropriate provider agency.

**Program Description:** The Parents as Partners program is designed to preserve and strengthen families through a strength based model building upon family assets, promoting self sufficiency and resiliency, helping families achieve their optimal development, and connecting families with natural and community resources for ongoing support and assistance. Toward this end we seek to intervene early into challenges presented in the family with assessment, family conferencing, education, and in-home case management to affect long-term child and family stability. Case management services include information and referrals to other community services providers as well as providing limited wraparound funds to help stabilize families as needed.

**Population Served:** Parents as Partners serve families who are at risk for child abuse and neglect and out of home placements.

Service Area: Services are provided by Catholic Charities in partnership with Partners of Hillsborough and Tampa Metro YMCA to resident from the following zip codes: 33569, 33534, 33572, 33573, 33570, 33598, and 33834. Three other service providers work in partnership with Partners of Hillsborough and Tampa YMCA to offer services throughout Hillsborough County, with remaining zip codes allocated to the nearest agencies. **Referral Process:** Families are referred to the program through Partners of Hillsborough by HKI and the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Department.

**Eligibility Criteria:** The program serves families and clients who have indications of risk for entering the foster care system in the future, but who have not yet been involved in the court process.

Service Fee Structure: Services are free of charge.

**Program Description:** The program is designed to intervene early into troubled relationships and life situations with counseling, education and case management to effect longer-term behavioral solutions. Life skills classes promote responsible behaviors, problem solving, self esteem, resiliency and values and goal setting for children and adults. Individual, marital and family counseling is provided to assist family members in coping with problems, building positive familial relationships and dealing with behavioral challenges. Case managements services assist families in accessing the support services needed to achieve stability. Services are provided in collaboration with other community based service provide services at Catholic Charities offices to improve access. Cultural and linguistic obstacles to access services for the Hispanic portion of the target population are addressed through bilingual Hispanic staff providing services.

**Population Served:** The REACH Families Program provide services to primarily low/mid income families who reside in East and South Hillsborough County

Service Area: East and South Hillsborough County

**Referral Process:** Referrals are received by phone, letter, or in person by service providers or as self-referrals by clients. Once the request for service is received the counselor/therapists complete the Initial screening form to help determine diagnostic eligibility for the program. Eligible clients are seen within a reasonable period of waiting. Call (813) 671-5250 for additional information.

**Eligibility Criteria:** Services are provided to individuals (adults and children), couples and families who are in need of counseling, case management and/or life skills education classes. The program is not designed to serve individuals with chronic mental health conditions.

**Program Description:** The Healthy Start Program provides home-based services to expectant and new mothers in order to reduce the incidence of low birth weight and to improve health and developmental outcomes for babies. Families are taught about health issues related to pregnancy and infant development. These services are provided by nurses, family counselors, social service coordinators, and Healthy Start educators. Topics covered by Healthy Start include prenatal and infant nutrition, breastfeeding, childbirth, infant care, family planning, stress management, alcohol and substance abuse, smoking cessation, and parenting techniques.

**Population Served:** Women who are pregnant and infants up to one year old in Hillsborough County.

Service Area: Hillsborough County

**Program Description:** Parents as Teachers (PAT) provides parent education and family support throughout pregnancy and until their child enters kindergarten. Parents receive support from PAT-certified Parent Educators who provide information on early brain development and offer specific when, what, how, and why advice for families. Parent Educators help parents to understand each stage of development and what to expect so that they can easily capture the teachable moments in everyday life to enhance their child's language development, intellectual growth, social development, and motor skills. Families are offered personal home visits, group meetings, screening and resource referrals. In addition to personal visits, PAT offers age-specific development groups throughout Hillsborough County and in collaboration with various schools, child care centers, and other early education providers. Educators are also available for various presentations and trainings.

**Population Served:** We serve any family, any baby throughout pregnancy and until the child enters Kindergarten.

Service Area: Hillsborough County

**Referral Process:** Self referral or agency referral. Call or email Program Director, Georgina Rivera.

**Eligibility Criteria:** Must live in Hillsborough County, be expecting or have a child up to the age of kindergarten entry.

**Program Description:** The Medicaid Targeted Case Management (TCM) for Children at Risk of Abuse and Neglect program is a Florida Medicaid program where federal dollars are matched by locally funded dollars (CBHC contract dollars) for Targeted Case Management services. Under the TCM At-Risk program, children and their families who live in Hillsborough County and are Medicaid eligible may receive case management and gain access to an array of services including medical, social, educational and other services that meet their needs.

In order to receive services from the TCM At-Risk program, children must (1) meet eligibility requirements for a program that provides TCM At-Risk case management services (see list below), and (2) meet TCM risk factor criteria, as identified in a formal assessment. Each case management program has its own eligibility parameters.

**Population Served:** Focus on children birth to age 8 who are at risk of abuse and neglect, and their families.

Service Area: Hillsborough County

**Referral Process:** The following is a list of programs that currently provide TCM At-Risk case management services with match dollars from the Children's Board. Contact the program directly; a program representative will determine whether the child(ren) meet program eligibility requirements:

**Program Description:** The Family And School Support Team (FASST) project is a school-based, community collaborative initiative sponsored by the Children's Board of Hillsborough County with supplemental funding from the School District of Hillsborough County and Medicaid. FASST programs may provide case management, tutoring, family support, information and referral, individualized intervention planning, linkages to community resources, mentoring and coaching, including mental health and non-traditional supports to school-age children who are experiencing behavioral, social/emotional and/or academic difficulties. Participation in FASST is voluntary, yet permission must be obtained from the parent(s) or guardian(s) agreeing to the referral. Services provided may vary based on the needs of the child whether in the home, at school, and/or at community agencies.

FASST Team Composition: The composition of a FASST team may consist of Family Advocates and/or Promotoras and a Family Support Coordinator. A larger team is built around this core to include the child, parents, caregivers, family members, informal natural supports, formal providers, and school personnel as well as anyone else that the family feels may help reach their goals. The FASST teams meet to develop (with the family taking a leading role) a Family Support Plan.

\*Disclaimer: Each FASST program may differ in the services they provide as well as with the compositions of their FASST Teams. For specific information please contact the program manager.

**Population Served:** Children in Kindergarten through 5th grade and their families.

Program Description: For more than 40 years, Hillsborough County Head Start/Early Head Start has helped prepare more than 60,000 lowincome children for school by providing early childhood and prenatal education; family, medical, dental, mental health, and social services; and 2/3 of USDA required daily nutritional needs. **Program Description:** The Division of Social Services provides the initial assessment and eligibility determination of county residents for services provided by the Department of Health & Social Services. Assessments are made from a case management standpoint to include all pertinent factors to assist the client in achieving their greatest level of self-sufficiency. Social Services focus on the holistic needs of the client. Social workers assist clients in becoming self-sufficient, obtaining a job or receiving training to obtain a better job so that they can meet their goals. Financial assistance can be provided on a very limited basis to assist in crisis situations. Ongoing financial assistance is usually not provided to clients except those meeting specific departmental criteria.

The Division of Social Services has five major intake offices - called Neighborhood Service Centers - each with satellite stes. In addition, the division is responsible for the summer food program, Community Action Program and the Homeless Recovery Program.

Assistance may include financial and medical services to alleviate crises and stabilize the household. Case management is provided along with employment services, life skills, budgeting and consumer credit classes and secondary education for those who choose to move forward to self sufficiency. Multiple partnerships are formed with other community resources to help move consumers through the service care network such as free tax preparation, English and GED classes, and tutoring. **Program Description:** Hillsborough Kids, Inc. (HKI) is a non-profit agency designed to perform the child welfare duties of Community Based Care (CBC) Lead Agency in Hillsborough County. As the CBC Lead Agency, HKI holds a single fixed price contract for all child protection services previously performed by the Department of Children and Families (DCF). DCF oversees child protection investigations and legal services through contracts with the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) Child Protective Division and the Office of the Attorney General (OAG).

HCSO Child Protection Investigators (CPI) investigate allegations of abuse, abandonment or neglect which are received by the abuse hotline. The CPI has 45-60 days to investigate these allegations. If the CPI feels the family could benefit from services to reduce the safety concerns to the children, they make a referral to HKI **Resource Specialists**. Not all cases are referred as there are over 1,100 investigations commenced each month. At the end of the investigation, the report is closed with no indicators, some indicators, or verified findings of the allegations. HKI Resource Specialists' objective is to keep children from entering the HKI system of care. By connecting the family to comprehensive, up-front services during the abuse investigation, HKI strives to resolve child safety concerns without further involvement with the judicial system. When the Resource Specialist receives a referral and a release of information from the CPI that is signed by the client, contact is made with the family. With the families' input, they determine which community provider(s) would best meet the service needs of the family. The Resource Specialist makes referrals for services and follows up with the family until the connections have been made.

The Resource Specialist also conducts bi-weekly Diversion Staffings. These staffings are comprised of a group of community service providers that come to the CPI office and listen to the facts of the investigation. The providers discuss which program would best meet the needs of the family, and accept the case as a referral for services, as appropriate. Most cases referred for Resource Specialist services would have been approved for judicial or court involvement if not for the service intervention that was made (i.e., the intervention reduced the safety concerns to the children).

During the investigation, if the child is found to be in eminent danger and no services intervention can ensure the safety of the child, the CPI will call the OAG for legal sufficiency to remove the child. If probable cause is granted, the parents will be given the time of the "shelter" court hearing. This is within 24 hours of the removal from the parents and the judge will hear the evidence of safety concerns and make a decision to return the children or keep them in an "out of home" placement. If the child remains out of the home, the CPI will transfer the case to HKI and the care management agency within 7-14 days of the removal. The OAG will file a formal petition of adjudication within 21 days, and the parents will consent or deny the petition. The parents and their attorney will enter a plea of consent or denial based on the counts made in the petition. Consenting to the petition will allow the court to make a finding that the child is "Adjudicated Dependant" (or withhold adjudication in some circumstances) and proceed to the case plan tasks gareed upon by all parties at a case planning conference held by the care management staff and CPI. A denial to the petition will continue with a trial date being set. The judge will hear testimony from both sides and make a decision as to the placement of the children. If the courts do not return the children to the parents after a trial, the case plan will be ordered. The parents and HKI will return to the courts for further hearings every 4-6 months to review the progress that they are making on their court ordered tasks until the children are reunified or it is determined that the goal needs to be changed due to the lack of progress on the case plan.

Hillsborough Kids, Inc. performs administrative services including financial management, data services, communications and quality assurance. Some HKI staff members are co-located at care centers as well as the HCSO office. Court ordered Case Management services for children and their families are performed by HKI's subcontracted Case Management agencies. These agencies are in three care centers: The North care center houses **Devereux** and **Gulf Coast Jewish Family Services.** The West care center houses **Youth and Family Alternatives, Children's Home, Inc.**, and **Camelot Community Care.** The East care center houses the **Children's Home Society.** 

Each of these Case Management agencies work with the parents, caregivers and children by continually assessing the safety risks to the children and writes referrals to providers who conduct the classes or tasks in which the client was court ordered to complete. The Care Manager conducts "staffings" throughout the supervision period, usually every 90 days, which allows all of the providers and clients to review the progress and assist in making decisions as to the recommendations to the courts. If the parents are completing the tasks on the case plan and safety concerns have been reduced, recommendations to reunify will be made. The Care Manager then writes a report, the Judicial Review, to the courts to inform the courts of the progress the client has made in regards to the court ordered case plan tasks.

If 12 months has passed since removal and the parent has not completed or made substantial progress on the case plan, a determination may be made to change the goal to adoption. At this time a consult with the OAG office is made and a termination of parental rights petition will be filed if there is evidence to show that the parent has had ample opportunity to receive services but has not availed themselves to do so. A trial date will be set and the judge will hear evidence and make a determination if the rights will be terminated or not. If the courts determine that parental rights should be terminated, a termination order is filed. At this time the parents have the right to appeal the decision. If an appeal is not filed the child(ren)'s case will be transferred to the adoption unit. The adoption unit will work with an adoptive placement or recruit an adoptive family for the child so that permanency can be obtained for the child.

**Population Served:** Residents of Hillsborough County who are under investigation for child abuse allegations, or who have been found by the courts to have abused, abandoned, or neglected their minor children in their care and are under court supervision.

**Service Area:** Hillsborough County. If the family is under court supervision and receiving case management services, the care center can be determined by the zip code of the residence in which the family became known to the CPIs.

**Referral Process:** The CPI makes referrals for the Resource Specialist to locate appropriate services for a family not under court supervision. Community providers can call if they know an investigation is on-going; however, if a family does not have an open investigation, please refer them to 2-1-1, Kid Connection Network, or a case management program that can assist them.

**Eligibility Criteria:** Residents of Hillsborough County who are under investigation for child abuse allegations, or who have been found by the courts to have abused, abandoned, or neglected their minor children in their care and are under court supervision.

Service Fee Structure: The client is responsible for all payment of fees for services which are referred or court ordered, unless the Care Management agencies or HKI Resource Specialist determine beforehand that the agency can absorb the cost.
